

Dixieland August Dance BY JOHN CRAWFORD

During the recent monthly board meetings, the board has been discussing how we can meet the desires of a larger membership. As part of that discussion, it was decided to vary our music with various band styles, yet keeping the tradition of Dixieland style music.

Remember, Dixieland Music includes more than just march music that is often associated with New Orleans. It also includes blues, and jazz. These styles include the waltz, foxtrot, and swing. Latin dances are not traditionally associated with Dixieland.

To achieve this end, the board agreed to try some new bands along with our traditional bands of the past. We still love our long relationship with our past bands, and will still include them. We will be asking them to include more of the waltz, foxtrots, swings, and blues in their song sets.

As an experiment, we hired John Pemberton to play for our August dance. Well, let me tell you, it was a great hit with those who attended the dance. We had around 90 people at the dance, and everyone I talked with wanted to have John back. It was what I call a love fest. I talked with John about coming back next year, but I did say, that he needed to learn some Dixieland songs to go with his wonderful repertoire of country style songs. He said that he would.

All in all, it seems we are on the right track to satisfying the local dance community. On October 14, 2018, at 1 PM we brought back the Cellblock 7. They have always been a hit with our attendees. Cellblock 7 plays a lot of danceable tunes. This was a costume dance for those who chose to dress up. In December on the 9th, we are again featuring The Stardusters with Mark Stolte leading. It will be a Christmas dress-up dance. Mark and his band are always a hit with our dance community.

JAZZ HISTORY

During the Roaring Twenties, music in particular underwent drastic changes that accurately represented the cultural evolution that was occurring during that decade of the twenties. This fundamental period of American music resulted in many important changes in song form, dance music, popular taste and production that still have a resounding effect on music to this day. These changes in the music business began largely with the new technologies that had been invented, such as radio, phonographs and significant advances in recording technology. The new recording technology allowed for many variations in song and singing form and style. In 1925, the older systems of recording were replaced with electric recording and microphones. This allowed the recording engineers to control the sounds in a more profound way, such as amplifying some sounds and quieting others. Also, the inventions of the radio and phonograph made music in general much more accessible and available to the public at large.

Jazz music in particular was born in New Orleans, Louisiana which was home to a hybrid racial community of White, Creole, and African American communities, as well as strong influences of French culture. This resulted in a variety of music such as ragtime, French and Italian opera, Caribbean music and spirituals which converged to form what is now known as jazz music (also called “hot music” in the 1920s).

Jazz music was—and is—strikingly different from any other type of music that had come before it because of the distinct combinations of a main melody, active counter melody, collective improvisation, accenting off beats and creating rhythms that pull against the main pulse of the music. Jazz music was also easily recognized by its syncopation, meaning that a variety of the rhythms were often unexpected or stressed a normally unstressed beat. Jazz music was rebellious, sheer energy that instantly caught the listener and propelled a catchy dance rhythm.

That camp is one of the reasons I'll be majoring in Musical Performance in Jazz in college. Jazz will always play a huge role in my life. The Sacramento Teagarden Jazz Camp provided an outstanding opportunity for me to learn new things. The camp taught me how to play traditional and dixieland jazz, exposed me to different levels of talent from my peers, and encouraged and challenged me to a positive learning experience to different jazz showcases.

I have been playing an alto saxophone in band and in jazz band, but i am learning how to play a soprano saxophone for our dixieland jazz group. At camp I learned how to play in the key of B flat, and I learned how to solo in all major scales. Playing the soprano saxophone was more difficult to play since I was just starting to learn. The instructors were really helpful and understanding.

One of the most challenging things I experienced was playing a solo in front of all of the instructors and campers. It really took me out of my comfort zone, but later I noticed I became more relaxed. Maybe it was because everyone else was placed in the same situation. Or, maybe because everyone encouraged us, and it didn't matter what our level of experience was. It really made it easy to admire all of the different levels of talent from the campers, and in turn it was much less intimidating.

My camp experience taught me how to improvise on the soprano saxophone and stage presence. I walked away with a great experience. I was lucky to attend the camp and I am grateful for the time that I spent there."

TEAGARDEN JAZZ CAMP

Jazz was born in America. The goal of Teagarden Jazz Camp is to ensure the survival of Traditional Jazz by "passing the torch" from experienced jazz artists to young musicians. The camp is focused on improvisation with an emphasis on turning theory into practice.

Campers receive semi-private lessons, group instruction, theory classes, and are assigned to bands with players of similar ability and experience. Students also participate in a nightly concert and jam sessions with councilors and faculty. There is also time for recreation, nature hiking, and relaxing in the beautiful foothills of the Sierra Nevada.






